## Dear Families:

It always amazes me how much we accomplish in the first half of the school year. I couldn't be more proud of the students and staff at SRS. The level of academic achievement and the character of this community are top-notch. This is evidenced by the art and student work hanging in the hallways, the publishing parties, readers theater, winter concert, physical activities, TEAM SRS events, and the support and kindness the staff and children provide to each other every day.

The 90th day of school was on Tuesday, January 23 and the first semester has ended. Report cards will come home through the backpack express on Friday, February 16. Students with more than five absences will also receive a letter regarding attendance.

SRS is still collecting textiles, clothes, shoes, and small household fabrics (like pillows and scatter rugs) for the Epilepsy Foundation. Please see the flier attached.


