Recently, Kindergarten spent their regularly-scheduled Wednesday in the Woods in the Swift River garden! Kindergarten families joined in to help clean out flower beds and plant a tea garden. While raking up leaves under the picnic tables, one family even found a spotted salamander!

Kindergartners have been enjoying herbal tea on their adventures during Wednesday in the Woods so they decided to grow their own! With help from families, they planted herbs like Mountain Mint, Chocolate Mint, Yarrow, Bee Balm, Lemon Balm, Anise Hyssop, and Chamomile. As the herbs grow, Kindergarten will dehydrate the leaves and flowers to brew tea in their Kelly Kettle. Kindergarteners also planted wildflowers to attract pollinators to keep the plants healthy!

Potential New After School Program

We are hoping to start a new Wednesday after school program for the 2022-2023 school year. If 12 students ages 6-12 sign up, Wolf Tree Programs LLC will work to offer a new program at Swift River School!

Wolf Tree youth programs are designed to create a supportive atmosphere for kids to grow, play, learn, and deepen their connection to nature. Kids are encouraged to follow their interests and explore the natural world through their senses. Combining outdoor skills, free play, and a long-term mentoring model, the youth programs provide a safe space for kids to be themselves and develop a deeper connection with the natural world. The common thread through all Wolf Tree programs is spending time outside and working with others in a way that values the natural styles and strengths of each member.

Program content will include:

- Naturalist knowledge (such as plant and animal identification)
- Ancestral skills (such as fire-making, crafts, and finding edible wild foods and medicines)
- Games and play
- Storytelling
- Wandering and exploring the land
- Forming positive group dynamics
- Positive role-modeling

This program would run from 1:00 – 5:00 PM on Wednesday afternoons in the woods behind the school. The session would run from September to June, with a break from mid-December to March, when the weather is coldest.

The cost is estimated to be between \$450 - \$550 (offered on a sliding scale) for roughly 30 program days.

This program would be modeled after the Wolf Tree Wild Coyotes after school program at Leverett Elementary School. Read more about their program at: http://www.wolftreema.com/wildcoyotes/.

Solidarity Farmshares: A New, Free program

Forty North Quabbin households will receive over \$100 of farm fresh veggies plus a container garden kit and recipes!

What is this program?

Solidarity Farmshares is a new program of Seeds of Solidarity Farm and Education Center in Orange MA. This opportunity is for low to moderate income households in the North Quabbin, funded through a grant.* It provides 40 households with \$100 in "veggie bucks" coupons to use at the Seeds of Solidarity farmstand at 165 Chestnut Hill Road in Orange, from June through November, at your convenience. Seeds of Solidarity specializes in tasty, organic salad and cooking greens, plus other vegetables. Each household will also receive a container garden kit, recipe booklet, shopping bag, and at the end of program in late fall, an abundant bag of fall veggies and other harvest items.

How does it work?

Fill out and submit the application by May 20th (you must meet the income guidelines, chart next page). We can accept 40 North Quabbin households. We will notify you by May 27th of acceptance.

You must also be able to stop by during one of two program welcome dates at Seeds of Solidarity. Thursday June 9th between 1-4PM OR Saturday June 11 between 2-5PM.

At the program welcome you will receive a booklet of "veggie bucks" for the first portion (valued at \$50) that you can use to redeem at the Seeds of Solidarity Farmstand at your convenience. You will also make and take a container garden kit at the program welcome, and meet the Seeds of

Solidarity staff and farmers. Kids are welcome.

There will be another date scheduled for August (date tbd) when you can pick up the second veggie bucks booklet (valued at \$50) and enjoy some farm snacks, then come back for a final harvest bag of goodies in late fall!






