Dear Families,

As we prepare to leave for February Break, we ask everyone to remain mindful of the safety recommendations we made prior to the Holiday Vacation, and we thank everyone for continuing to consider them best practice once more, with the shared goal of



keeping our school community safe and healthy. My hope is that we will return to school on February 28 without any positive cases. As we've requested previously, we ask that if your family's plans include travel or hosting guests, you please provide negative COVID-19 test results for your students upon their return to school.

With the snow banks piling up and our driveway narrowing with each storm, it is especially important to make sure we are driving through slowly and watching out for people. Please keep in mind that three cars can pull in after the buses have entered the yard. We still ask that the rest of the cars continue to wait on the road. Please use the fence as a guide for where to line up. Having the line of cars start a little further back gives the buses more room to pull out, and for them to make sure no cars are pulling around the waiting cars and heading in their direction. Also, please be aware that during arrival and dismissal times, there are students exiting and entering both sides of their vehicles. Unless you have been directed to proceed past a parked vehicle by a staff member, please do not ever pass a vehicle parked in the driveway. Thank you for your patience as we work to ensure safety for our students.

When we return from February Break, storyteller and returning guest, Motoko, will be re-joining us to lead our students in Origami Adventures! We are so grateful to Motoko, and to our art teacher, Ms. Neal, for co-writing a Massachusetts Cultural Council grant this fall that made it possible to bring this project to Swift River. And, we are so excited to start this collaboration! Motoko will be here during the month of March and we will hold a culminating event at the end of this series.
