NOTES FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Families:

Thank you to the families who have been donating their returnable bottles and cans to the Nature's Classroom fundraiser and to the volunteers who are separating and returning them. In six weeks we have raised \$140.15, which is one fifth of the total tuition for one student. If your family drinks beverages in returnable bottles and/or cans, please consider dropping them off at the school by the garage, or even dropping them off during arrival and dismissal. We will gladly accept them at any time!

Next week we are off to visit the Audubon Society in Princeton, MA. Students will hike through the trails and learn about the native plants and animals there. This field trip is funded by the Audubon Society. Please make sure to send your student with a full water bottle. Also, please make sure your student is wearing closed-toed shoes with socks up over their pants, long sleeve shirts, hats and bug spray, since tick season is still upon us!

On Thursday, October 26, you will receive a packet from the school. Included in this packet will be a letter that is attached to this issue of the Current. This packet will give you information about your student's assessments in ELA and Math at the beginning of the year. We hope that you will bring Friday, October 20

this material with you at your Family-Teacher Conference time to learn more about the progress your child is making, since we assessed them earlier this year. If you have yet to sign up for a time for your Family-Teacher Conference, please be sure to do so as soon as possible.

Keep an eye out for information coming home about our new Backpack Buddies program! In the next few months, we will start sending home a weekend supply of nutritious food for children when school lunch and breakfast are unavailable. Each bag will contain two breakfasts and two lunches, and all food is provided to children free of charge. We hope these resources will support the health, behavior and achievement of every student who participates. All children will be eligible for this program. Please reach out if you have any questions and/or want to participate.

I know it may feel like we are inundated with fundraisers right now and we appreciate your generosity in supporting these endeavors. The cost of field trips has increased immensely over the last ten years. Another fundraiser we are just starting is a collection of textiles for the Epilepsy Foundation. We are collecting all sorts of clothes, shoes, bags, towels, sheets, jackets and many other items (see attached flier). These items are repurposed and stay in New England. Any items that are soiled or torn are also repurposed. Please feel free to send in bags of clothes and other items in trash bags. We will be wrapping up this fundraiser in mid-December. Please also see the fliers attached to this issue of the current for more fundraising opportunities!

We are currently looking for parent and community representatives for the School Council. This group meets approximately 4-6 times a school year. Please let me know if you are interested.

Student Artwork Display



Dear Swift River School Families.



Dear Caregivers,

The information included in this packet will contain beginning of the year data from Fall academic screenings for your child. Students were assessed in English Language Arts (ELA) and mathematics as required in Massachusetts regulation 603 CMR 28.03(1)(f), which requires all public schools in the state to assess students' reading skills in grades K-3 at least twice a year.

Students were assessed for ELA benchmarks using the DIBELS 8 Screener (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills) and the Universal Screener for Number Sense for mathematics benchmarks. These screeners offer a snapshot into your child's learning and offer insight into students' strengths and areas of growth for students.

Both the DIBELS and the Universal Screener create reports for families that communicate each student's performance on these measures. When you receive these reports from your child's school please remember that this is one snapshot of your child. We use these reports to identify students who may need additional support beyond the general classroom experience. This support may include intervention materials as provided by core content curriculum, or it may include the use of specialized intervention programs that target specific skills, as reflected in the Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) model (Multi-Tiered Systems of Support). This model ensures that all students receive appropriate levels of support based on their needs at any given time and in any given area.

Please keep in mind that these assessments were conducted in the first few weeks of school. It is normal that some students experience some academic regression due to the many weeks of summer vacation. At this point, students have been actively participating in 8 weeks of instruction. Many students have already shown advancement in various indicators that may have been flagged as areas of concern in early September. We encourage you to take these results to your family conference that will be occurring in the next few weeks. Our staff will be able to answer any questions you may have, as well as share a current progress update on your child.
