- FY20 Budget
 - Review of changes since the last budget
 - Removal of circuit breaker and Kindergarten funding
 - \$20 per child in state aid (\$2500 in total towards the budget)
 - Overall increase to budget: \$114,008 (4.1%)
 - \$167,258 (6.8%) an increase of revenue needed [due to reduced funding aspects]
 - Jo Comerford is holding a meeting on April 18th to address state-level funding of education in rural districts
