A. Public Hearings

- Community Network for Children update Gillian Budine
 - Provide families with comprehensive services (housing, food, etc)
 - Prompt school readiness
 - Grant is near 84k, submitted continuation grant this week
 - o Raises additional 5k each year
 - o SAC fundraiser was 1200
 - 220 families participating on monthly basis
 - o Family needs have risen
 - Summer program at Northfield Mountain outdoor, 160-190 people attended weekly last summer
 - Friends of Libraries fund the summer playgroups in the town libraries

C. Superintendent's Report

- No official report but update regarding rural school issues with state reps and senators (organized by Comerford). We are 'held harmless' and will receive no additional aid.
 - Charter schools impacting Amherst area schools
 - o We are not benefiting from regionalization in this area
 - Wendell is close to reaching the tax cap
 - Revisiting Chapter 70 funding level
- Are there studies on the impact of long bussing distance both on younger and older students
- Bussing is not fully funded for the schools

D. Director of Finance and Operations Report

- Review of FY20 Budget Vote
 - Same budget, E&D certified
 - 35k for E&D upped to 50k
 - New total gross budget: \$2,878,433, town responsibility: \$1,881,651
 - Carla moves to approve the budgets, Jack 2nd passes with 7 yes, one abstention
 - Will received 21,657 in rural aid. Asking to approve this for teacher salaries to replace the circuit breaker money that was not received
 - o If we have approved to pay salaries, do we need to approve to this?
 - Circuit breaker can only be used to offset certain costs
 - Vote not necessary but suggested
 - Carla moves to use rural aid towards paying teachers salaries Beth 2nds. Unanimous
 - Design team met: bid for work \$1,238,000 for windows and doors [under the estimate]
 - 800k from MSBA, remainder from towns (160k per town)
 - Is the school committee with running this project (borrowing and repayment of funds) through the school books? Makes reporting cleaner. Committee raised no concerns
 - FinComs from both towns have approved the town funding for the building project
