- Sent out U28 quarterly newsletter
- Four rural aides, rural school reports required by DESE completed
- Amendments submitted to SOA comprehensive updates from student opportunity act plans revised from 2021
  - Addiotnal ESSER funding
- DESE has a new IEP improvement act
  - New guidelines, updating IEP forms
- Readiness and emergency school training offering new training

- Thanks to the DPW of both towns for keeping the driveways open and the roads of the towns safe
- Question: should the school get a generator? Shared expense between the towns
  - The is an ongoing discussion
  - Currently not eligible for grant funding for one
- Question: Is there a plan for alternative sites if the school closes for extended periods?
  - Blizzard bag days no longer count as school days
  - o Physical relocation is not a completed plan many factors
  - The days will need to be made up, possibly over a vacation

      - Update from DESE and Legal Counsel
      - In order to change articles of agreement regarding the language of the Swift River School

- agreement, the towns will need to file special legislation with the state
- Mahar gets the regional transportation funds for the towns; for Swift River, the individual towns get the funds
- Swift River is similar to all other regional school districts apart from the transportation funding, and there is a difference in the rules regarding the budget for two towns if there is no agreement
- Reimbursement comes after each town has submitted the End of year report
- There are some advantages to regionalizing traditionally, especially with personnel turnover and learning the way a two-town region functions
- Swift River can apply for grants as a region

# o FY24 NSW Draft Budget

- Question about Professional Development Funding
  - o Those funds are usually central office funds
  - Each school has a different PD funding line, recently from ESSER
- The curriculum coordinator position explained
- No changes to the budget since last month, it has just been approved and is no longer Draft
  - Admin portion is mainly U28, small increases mainly, overall 3.4%
  - Instruction based on new contracts -8.7% increase
  - Other school services accounts have shifted with new budgeting projections -23.2% increase
  - Biggest change to the budget is Special Education for Mass Schools
    - Reimbursement and circuit breaker money will come in in future years to offset the incurred expense
- Wendell town treasury requested of a committee member if there is a possibility to add a buffer to the transportation line to avoid needing to call special town meetings to adjust the funding as needed
- No official vote taken

#### o In-Person NSW meetings - Discussion and Vote

- Beth moves to return to in-person meetings in March, and Steve seconds
